

Goodwill Goodturn Patch Program

The Goodwill Goodturn Day Patch Program is geared toward helping Girl Scouts to put on a donation drive in their community while focusing on the Girl Scouts' three Leadership Keys: Discover, Connect and Take Action!

To earn a patch, the entire troop must participate in this program. Each girl can do a Discover and Connect requirement on their own, and then the troop must come together to put on the Take Action portion of the program.

DISCOVER what Goodwill does to help people in your community! (Choose One)

1. Invite a Goodwill representative to come and speak with your group about what Goodwill does to help people in your area and how your troop can help by putting on a donation drive.
2. Learn how to put on a donation drive and what happens to those donations. Then break up into groups and put skits to show what Goodwill does with the donations it receives.
3. Find out some fun facts about Goodwill and share it with your troop, family and friends:
 - a. How much waste Goodwill saves from being dumped in landfills each year?
 - b. What is Goodwill's mission?
 - c. What happens to the donations Goodwill receives?
 - d. How can you put on a donation drive?

CONNECT with the people in your community! (Choose One)

1. Create flyers and posters to hang around town and in your schools to promote your donation drive.
2. Contact your local government representative and tell them that you're a Girl Scout who cares about helping people with disabilities and barriers to employment find work! Ask them if they know what Goodwill does with the donations it receives and invite them to participate in your donation drive.
3. Contact local media and invite them to your donation drive!
4. Get a local school, church or business to allow you to host your donation drive at their location and ask them to help promote it to the public!

TAKE ACTION and help Goodwill fulfill its mission!

1. Host a donation drive! Contact your local Goodwill and let them know your troop is hosting a donation drive and ask them to come out with a truck to provide bins and pick up any donations you receive. Invite family and friends; think up some fun games and activities for your donors to participate in. Make it fun! Some troops put on donation drive picnics or dinners! You could do a donation drive movie night with a local theatre. Get creative and **take action** to help people in your community!



To participate in the Goodwill Goodturn Patch Program, do a Discover and Connect activity and then do the Take Action activity as a troop!
